Santa Barbara County

PURPOSE

This advice filing complies with direction given to Southern California Edison Company (SCE) by Energy Division Staff to file an Advice Letter pursuant to General Order (GO) 96-B, General Rule 7.6.1 for the replacement of deteriorated 66 kilovolt (kV) wood poles with equivalent 66 kV lightweight steel (LWS) poles in accordance with GO131-D, Section III.B.1.b.

BACKGROUND

Over the next several years, SCE plans to replace deteriorated 66 kV wood poles within the Coastal Zone in unincorporated Santa Barbara County. Poles requiring replacement will be identified on an ongoing basis through SCE's inspection and maintenance program consistent with CPUC GOs 95 and 165. GO 95 sets forth the "requirements for overhead line design, construction, and maintenance, the application of which will ensure adequate service and secure safety to persons engaged in the construction, maintenance, operation or use of overhead lines and to the public in general." GO 165 establishes "requirements for electric distribution and transmission facilities... regarding inspections in order to ensure safe and high-quality electrical service. "

Many of the existing 66 kV wood poles have been identified for replacement because of extensive damage caused by woodpeckers. SCE proposes to replace existing wood poles with LWS poles to mitigate the impact of woodpeckers, as well as to reduce the frequency by which poles are currently being replaced, thus minimizing maintenance, and disruption of service. LWS poles are a functional equivalent to wood poles, as they are direct buried, and are of similar height and circumference as the existing wood poles to be replaced.

Pursuant to Commission GO 131-D, Section III.B.1, projects meeting specific conditions are exempt from the Commission's requirement to file for an application requesting authority to construct. SCE proposes to replace deteriorated 66 kV wood poles with equivalent LWS poles consistent with the following exemption:

"b. the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures."

This advice filing is intended to only apply to replacement of deteriorated 66 kV wood poles within the Coastal Zone in unincorporated Santa Barbara County that meet all of the following conditions:

- 66 kV wood poles proposed for replacement with 66 kV LWS poles;
- Replacement 66 kV LWS poles are no more than 10 feet higher than existing 66 kV wood pole heights;
- Per GO 131-D Section III.B.2, none of the conditions specified in Section 15300.2 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines exist; and
- The replacement of poles will not result in any increase in capacity pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15302.

The CPUC requires utilities to employ "no cost" and "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields (EMF). In accordance with "EMF Design Guidelines" filed with the CPUC in compliance with CPUC Decisions 93-11-013 and 06-01-042, SCE will implement applicable measures to replacement of deteriorated poles.

This advice filing is made more than 30 days before the date such replacement is intended to begin. Starting in November 2012, and on an ongoing basis, poles will be identified for replacement, and upon completion of any required Local Coastal Program review by the County of Santa Barbara, and receipt of any applicable ministerial permits (e.g., encroachment permits) they will be replaced.

No cost information is required for this advice filing.

This advice filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Pursuant to GO 96-B, Energy Industry Rule 5.2(4), this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation.
