SUBJECT: Supplement to and Partial Withdrawal of Advice 2894-E
Regarding Contracts for Procurement of Renewable Energy
Resulting From Southern California Edison Company's
("SCE's") Third Renewable Auction Mechanism ("RAM 3")
Request for Offers ("RFO")

I. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

On May 1, 2013, SCE submitted Advice 2894-E in compliance with the California Public Utilities Commission's ("Commission's" or "CPUC's") Decision ("D.")10-12-048¹ (the "Decision" or "D.10-12-048"), Resolution E-4414,² Resolution E-4489,³ and Resolution E-4546⁴ seeking approval of thirteen ("13") RAM 3 power purchase agreements ("RAM Contracts") resulting from SCE's RAM 3 RFO.

Since that time, two of these RAM 3 Contracts terminated due to the failure of the sellers to provide development security as required in each contract. The failed projects are noted in strikethrough font in the table below:

Accordingly, pursuant to General Order (“GO”) 96-B, General Rules 5.3 and 7.5.1, SCE submits Advice 2894-E-A to: 1) supplement Advice 2894-E, in part, in order to reflect these changes⁵ and 2) withdraw SCE’s original request for CPUC approval of the terminated contracts.⁶

⁵ GO 96-B, General Rule 7.5.1 provides that “[t]he utility shall file a supplement or withdraw the advice letter without prejudice in order to make major revisions or corrections. A substitute sheet or supplement shall be filed and served in the same manner and on the same persons as the advice letter, plus any other persons who have filed a protest or response. A supplement shall bear the same identifying number as the advice letter but shall have a letter suffix (“A” for the first supplement, “B” for the second supplement, etc.).”

⁶ GO 96-B, General Rule 5.3 provides that a utility may withdraw an Advice Letter without prejudice prior to the date of issuance, for public review and comment, of a draft resolution thereof.

Except as noted above, this filing will not increase any rate or charge, conflict with any other schedule or rule, or cause the withdrawal of service.

II. TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to the Decision and Resolution E-4546,⁷ this Advice 2894-E-A is submitted with a Tier 2 designation which is the same Tier designation as the original filing, Advice 2894-E.

III. EFFECTIVE DATE

This supplemental advice filing will become effective on the same day as the original filing, Advice 2894-E, which is May 31, 2013.⁸

IV. PROTEST

Pursuant to GO 96-B, General Rule 7.5.1,⁹ SCE requests that the Commission maintain the original protest and comment period as designated in Advice 2894-E and not reopen the protest period or allow additional comments. The changes included in this supplemental advice filing only remove terminated RAM 3 Contracts, thereby reducing the number of contracts subject to Commission approval, and in no way impact the Commission's review of the remaining RAM 3 Contracts.
