# Off-Peak Savings Plan (Schedule TOU-D-T)

Our Off-Peak Savings Plan is a Time-of-Use (TOU) rate plan offering different electricity prices based on the day and time your household uses electricity.


### Why Switch to a Time-of-Use Rate Plan?

- Take advantage of lower rates on weekends, holidays and evening hours.
- If you can reduce your electricity usage on summer weekdays between noon and 6 p.m. you'll be able to take advantage of lower rates during other times of the day/year.
- There are only 4 summer months where rates are the highest, the other 8 months of the year rates are lower.
- Leverage the ability to achieve lower overall annual electricity costs (bills may be higher in the summer, but off-set by lower winter bills).

### How Do TOU Rates Work?

The Off-Peak Savings Plan (Schedule TOU-D-T) charges different prices during different times of the day, week, and season. Rates during weekends and off-peak hours are much lower, while rates for electricity used during weekday peak hours (12 p.m. – 6 p.m.) are higher. Most holidays are considered off-peak.

### Seasonal Savings

With the Off-Peak Savings Plan, you may see most of your annual savings during the 8 non-summer months (October through May), when off-peak energy rates are the lowest. Higher on-peak rates are charged on weekdays during the 4 summer months (June through September), so your energy use should be carefully managed to receive maximum savings.

### “Level” Pricing Structure

The Off-Peak Savings Plan has two pricing “levels” rather than the multi-tiered pricing structure offered with the basic residential rate plan (Schedule D). The amount of energy allocated to Level 1 for the Off-Peak Savings Plan aligns with amount of energy allocated to Tiers 1 and 2 of the basic residential rate plan. All other electricity use is allocated to Level 2 of the plan.
